The end of the Book of Job is actually funny. Job's respectful though complaining questions are stopped at Chapter 38, when God has some questions of His own -- for us ALL:

"Where were you when I laid the foundations of the earth? Tell Me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements? Surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? [[Is this an Old Testament reference to the Equator??]] To what were its foundations fastened? Or who laid its cornerstone, when the morning stars sang together?.."

Job had reached this conclusion in Chapter 13, Verse 15: "Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him. Even so, I defend my own ways before Him." [23:3:] "Oh, that I knew where I might find Him that I might come to His seat!" When Job's hope had vanished, God came like a mighty wind, reminding us of the Holy Spirit's description in Acts. When Jesus left this earth, He sent us His Holy Spirit... see John 14 through 17. So we DO know where to find God to question Him respectfully. We find God WHEREVER we are when we invite Him respectfully and TRUST Him when we are still left with our BURNING QUESTIONS.

The Bible Reference Romans 10:9 is not spelled out in this song; here are 3 versions of God's simple step-by-step guide for persons like me who need help understanding, who are constantly praying James 1:5's prayer for God's wisdom:

Beginning with Romans 10:3 to 4, which describes the way we usually are at first, unable to believe God's salvation is ours just for asking him so that we work hard to try to "earn heaven" --- "*For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and seeking to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted to the righteousness of God. **For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.***" I didn't quite understand verse 4 as I typed this, so I looked up multiple versions on www.BlueLetterBible.org and found this New Living Translation version that I better understand: "For Christ has accomplished the whole purpose of the law. **All who believe in him are made right with God.**" Romans 10: 9 = "... if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, **you will be saved.**" - *New King James Version*
