Song Story: THE MUSIC

There are FOUR basses playing in this humor song. If you pan your stereo sound controls from left to middle to right, you can hear completely different "mixes" of each bass. I personally like panning to hear the high bass, all done well above fret 12 on the two highest sounding strings. As far as I know, this hasn't been done before. The key: Each bass has its own "sonic space" that avoids slurring into another bass's fretboard territory. **Why did I do it?** Just for fun.... the idea just "came" to me. Claxton played the poppy low bass... I still haven't mastered slap bass. Then I recorded the three slide bass tracks that I'd already designed for duet playing with a bass student, teaching him to play above Fret 5. **At first I was just experimenting** to see which bass design I preferred to add above the slap bass. But I still remember the moment the thought came to my mind in the studio: "HEY - LET'S SEE WHAT HAPPENS when we play ALL 4 BASS TRACKS TOGETHER." And I still laugh to remember the funny look I got for my suggestion ('twas one of my earliest studio songs). And laugh at the amazement we both felt when it WORKED. Wow, God comes up with some weird ideas to inspire His people with!
