Suggested SCRIPTURES between verses.

BEFORE verse 1: Exodus 9:27. "And Pharaoh sent & called for Moses and Aaron, and said to them, "I have sinned this time. The LORD *is* righteous, and my people and I *are* wicked."

After verse 1: Exodus 9:27 and 34. "And Pharaoh sent & called for Moses and Aaron, and said to them, "I have sinned this time. The LORD *is* righteous, and my people and I *are* wicked." Verse 34: "...when Pharaoh saw that the rain, the hail, and the thunder had ceased, he sinned yet more; and he hardened his heart, ..."

After Verse 2: Exodus 10:16. "Then Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron in haste, and said, "I have sinned against the LORD your God and against you."

After Verse 3: Jesus warned that God is NOT fooled even in a temple when people SAY all the RIGHT religious words when WRONG self-centeredness is in their hearts. Luke 18: 10-11: [**Jesus**] spoke this parable: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed ... with himself..."

After Verse 4: THE COMPETE STORY:

Luke 18: 9- 14. [**Jesus**] spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves that *they* were righteous, and despised others: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men—extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise *his* eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!'"

I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."
