Song Story. I'd written draft music a full year earlier, as I prayerfully continued develop-ing music for more of the LORD's psalms of honest sorrow and joy, peace and fear. Music to help us remember the Truth of Who God is, and His love shown throughout the Bible. But I couldn't figure out what to do with Verse 2. On the day I wrote this final music, I DID understand, by God's guidance: God loves our honesty. And our feelings.
